Peace Corps is in real need of applicants with English/ESL teaching and tutoring skills, or who are open to gaining a few months of volunteer experience in these areas to qualify. Graduates in all majors could qualify for these programs. Additionally, Peace Corps needs volunteers to work in education; agriculture, forestry and environment; public health and HIV/AIDS prevention; youth and community development; and business and IT. Knowledge of French, Spanish or another language is helpful, although Peace Corps teaches language to its volunteers. Volunteers of all backgrounds and ages are serving in a variety of fields in 77 countries across the globe. Peace Corps volunteers must be U.S. citizens and at least 18 years of age, but there is no upper age limit for Peace Corps service.
