For SUMMER SEMESTER 2010 internships in public policy

- Students in ANY major are eligible to receive scholarships in the Gordon and Norma Guyer Endowed Internship Program
- Students must arrange to be employed in a public policy related internship and enroll for MSU internship credit
- Scholarships of at least \$1,000 will be applicable towards a student's tuition
- Students receiving a scholarship are expected to participate in activities of the Guyer program including an orientation session before the internship begins and a reception following internship completion

Academic performance; initiative; willingness to learn from others; ability to achieve internship goals; interest and experience in public policy; evidence that internship will offer challenging opportunities; relevance of proposed internship to public policy
