VACANCY ANNOUNCEMENT FOR PLANT PROTECTION AID TEMPORARY EMPLOYMENT

Position: The U.S. Department of Agriculture is in need of (1) one Plant Protection Aid to assist with insect trapping activities from approximately May 15 through September 15.

Who May be Considered: Must be a United States citizen, and 18 years or older.

Physical Requirements: Work is primarily out of doors and is performed in most types of weather conditions. Driving will be required. Must be able to walk, stand, reach, bend, stoop, throw, and carry up to 20 pounds.

Key Requirements: High School graduate, a valid Wisconsin driver's license and good driving record. Prefer individuals with some college level course work in the life sciences (biology, zoology, botany, entomology, etc). Must have a vehicle available and in good operating condition; mileage will be paid.

Description of Duties: After training, the incumbent works independently to install and service insect traps used to detect exotic insects. Incumbent contacts and interacts with land owners/managers and the public. Locates potential or known trap locations from maps and/or aerial images and navigates to these points by shortest route. Collects data using GPS units, PDA's and records the collected information. Sorts collected insect specimens for identification.

Duty station: Milwaukee, WI (work in surrounding counties and south to the Illinois state line).

Pay and Work Schedule: Salary range: \$11.95 to 13.87 per hour. Work schedule will be flexible M-F, 40 hours per week.
