STUDENT CRITERIA

- Must be a Sophomore, Junior or Senior at an accredited 4-year academic institution or graduate of an accredited community college with plans to further his/her educational endeavors.
- Have successfully completed an Urban Forestry Mgmt course or its equivalent, and 3 out of the 6 following courses: Dendrology, Spatial Sciences, Pathology, Entomology, Arboriculture, Biometrics.
- Have a CUMULATIVE GPA of 2.75 or higher on a 4.0 grading scale.

HOW TO APPLY

- Complete the attached MFI-P application
- Submit an OFFICIAL University transcript SEALED from your current University.
- Submit one, and only one, Letter of Recommendation from an individual employed by your current academic institution.
- Submit one, and only one, Letter of Recommendation from an individual who has seen your level of service in your local community -OR- your current employer.
- Submit a copy of your valid drivers license.

REQUIRED ESSAY QUESTIONS

Each applicant must also submit responses to EACH of the following.

1. In 250 words or less, explain your career goals, your expectations of the internship program, and how the internship program will benefit by having you as a part of its 2012 class.
2. In 250 words or less, respond to the following scenario as completely as possible:

Scenario: Assume you manage the urban forest in a city that has a very limited budget for street tree maintenance. Several of the city's trees have a destructive, infectious disease. A recent inventory revealed that there are several hazardous trees along streets. The inventory also recommends pruning cycles. Every day you receive customer requests to prune trees, and you are strongly encouraged to plant trees.

Question: Describe how you would prioritize your maintenance activities to specifically address all of these items, and justify your rationale for doing so.

All applicants will be required to complete a background investigation prior to employment.
